O. D. Wyatt High School was established in 1968. It educates the southeastern extreme of Fort Worth. Named after Oscar Dean Wyatt, a former administrator in the Fort Worth Independent School District, O. D. Wyatt has enjoyed a high reputation in athletics and the fine arts throughout its history. Wyatt, as it is affectionately known, was expanded in the 1970's and the new wing is now the home of the 9th Grade Academy. Wyatt also is the home of small learning communities where students follow a curriculum and course study that matches their interests. In addition to the 9th Grade Academy, small learning communities are comprised of Career Tech, Performing Arts, Health Science and Human Services, and Business and Computer Technologies.

### Air & Ground Transportation AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY

Students may earn dual credit hours in their junior and senior years.

Industry partnerships include Sewell Lexus, Sewell Infiniti, Freeman Toyota, and the Tarrant County College T-10 program.

There is high potential for job placement for students who have their drivers license.

### Architecture & Construction CONSTRUCTION TECHNOLOGY

Students may earn up to 13 dual credit hours in their senior year with Tarrant County College South's Construction Management Technology Department.

Opportunities for students to apply their woodworking and project design skills in collaboration with industry partners and TEXO Foundation. Students have the opportunity to take NCCER certification exams.

### Collegiate Academy EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL

Wyatt's 2021 Dual Credit Scholars will be the first class to graduate with Associate of Arts Degree.

In the 2018-2019 school year, 28 ninth graders earned an average of 10 college credit hours.

86 students are on track to earn 60+ hours toward TCC South Campus' Associate of Arts Degree.

### Medical & Public Service MEDICAL

Students have opportunities to earn their CPR certification and OSHA certification.

Students can elect to pursue a Pharmacy Technician, Emergency Medical Technician, or Patient Care Technician pathway. Each pathway ends in its own certification exam.

Students participate in HOSA Chapter Area competitions with the opportunity to advance to

State and National competitions.

Students learn hands-on as they participate in rotations to various pharmacy settings.

### Hospitality & Tourism CULINARY ARTS

Students learn the exciting, fast-paced world of culinary arts in the Soul of Wyatt Bistro.

Students compete in professional competitions, having won numerous awards at prior competitions.

Opportunities include catering school and citywide functions. These outstanding learning experiences have included preparing dinner for Mayor Betsy Price and the Fort Worth City Council.

Students have the opportunity to take ServSafe Handler, ServSafe Manager, and ServSafe Allergens certification exams throughout the four-year program.

Students graduate prepared for immediate job entry, as well as post-secondary education, in culinary arts.



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
